

Poster Display for Scholarship Recipients

Each scholarship recipient is invited to bring a poster presenting one specific project your organisation is especially proud of.

What should be on our poster?

Please let us know what the project is about and why you are proud of it, and how it impacted your community.

This could be, for example:

- a family event or community/multistakeholder workshop
- an advocacy campaign,
- a technical platform or
- support service for the community.

The goal is not to describe your organisation in general, but to showcase one concrete initiative that reflects your work and impact.

Ideally you also add some pictures or graphic to make the poster more attractive.

What should be the size of our poster?

The standard poster size is **A0, portrait orientation** and posters should be prepared in English. If your poster is slightly larger or smaller, that is fine. You can print your poster on paper or fabric, whichever you prefer.

We do not have a poster...

If you do not yet have a poster, you can easily create one using PowerPoint, Canva, or similar tools. If this is not possible, you may bring flyers, though this will be suboptimal, as posters will be displayed in a public area also visited by researchers, clinicians, and industry partners.

How will our poster be displayed?

Each display board will include the name of your organisation, so we encourage you to make use of this opportunity and not be the one organisation without a poster! It is a great chance to show your work and connect with others.
